Memorandum this 6<sup>th</sup> day of January 1814

That Philip Shipworth of South Kelsey House in the County of Lincoln Esquire has sold unto Edmund Robson of Yaddlethorpe in the Parish of Bottesford in the said County of Lincoln Farmer All that Post Mill situate at Ashby in the parish of Bottesford together with the Sails Stones as well as the Corn Screen and Flour Machine and other fixtures and also the Piece of land thereunto belonging containing six Acres and a half or there abouts as the same are now in the occupation of John Scarborough for the sum of Eight hundred and forty Pounds five hundred of which is to be paid on the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of May next when Possession is to be then given to the said Edmund Robson and the remaining Three hundred and forty pounds is to remain on the said Premises by way of Mortgage – The said Philip Shipworth to be at the expense of making out his Title and the other Expenses relating to this Sale and also the expense of the Mortgage to be paid by the said Edmund Robson As witness our Hands the day and Year first above written
