In principle we accept the offer contained in your letter of the lith ultimo, but we wish to have clarified the position regarding the actual workers at the Mill. It is assumed that cover for the workers is contained in the public liability cover of £750,000. I do apologise for the long delay in replying to your letter of the 18th November last, and I very much appreciated the kindness in enclosing a stamped-addressed envelope.

One reason for the delay was because I wished to discuss with the Mill Committee the feasibility of having a "Society of Friends" for the Mill. Unfortunately at the meeting it was not possible to come to any definite decision.

The present situation is that the Hassocks Amenity Association is a general "pressure group" in the area covering the Parishes of Clayton and Keymer, and one of the activities of the Association is the restoration of the above Mill. Membership of the Association is primarily residents of the two Parishes, or those near to the two Parishes who might be affected by planning problems on the boundaries of the said Parishes.

When it was decided to accept the challenge to restore Oldland Mill a separate Committee from the main Executive Committee of the Association was set up, and it has been the work of the Mill Committee to raise money for the Mill. To date this has been done by fund raising events, and donations, sometimes in the form of covenants; however as work progresses and folk are now appreciative of the fact that restoration work is in hand, interest is coming from further afield, and for this reason the thought of a "Society of Friends" has arisen. One problem, of course, is the tax situation and it might be difficult to have a separate group within an existing Charity.

I appreciate that this is rather a negative letter from your point of view, but as the situation is a present may I respectfully suggest, if it is appropriate, that you might like to enter into a covenant for the Mill, and, accordingly, I enclose a covenant form. Thank you for your letter of the 8th November last, to which I regret it has taken me so long to reply.

One reason for the delay was trying to get any further information generally about Oldland Mill, and I have now found out that a Mr. Godwin, who lives in Keymer, resides in a house where one Sarah Turner used to live and at one time there were a number of documents and maps of the Turner (Oldland) Estate in the house. Mr. Godwin is now 88, but I have today written to him to see if it will be possible for me to visit him and ascertain whether he has still got the said documents. If any relevant information does materialise, then I will pass same on to you.

As to the Mill Violet McDermot mentioned to you, Violet also showed me her papers, and in fact I have walked the site of the 1624-1870 mill; however I am not absolutely sure that this was in fact a mill for grinding corn because when researching the Ditchling area I have found a number of mills which appeared to exist for a variety of reasons other than for grinding corn.

It is certainly important to the Mill Committee to try and establish the age of the present Mill on the Oldland site, and in this connection I know there are some repair accounts in the Records Office in Lewes, which, now my husband has retired and I can have the care more frequently, I hope to inspect. I gather the accounts relate to work which the Turner family had carried out, and possibly are dated in the 1850-60 period; however the accounts might reveal why the repairs were carried out and from this it might be possible to get a better idea of the age of the Mill.

I confirm that photographs are being taken at every stage of the present activities at the Mill, and a record is being made of "marks" etc. which appear. We know the present windshaft was put in by Medhurst, and from a carving on the main post one can assume that before the Medhurst work there was a wooden windshaft in the Mill. As to pine wood in the Mill, it would appear that most of the woodwork in Oldland Mill is oak, and certainly all the main timbers are oak. In passing I would mention that it is proving something of a problem to get oak in the large dimensions which we require. We have been fortunate in that we have got the oak for the **cremstibe**, but we are waiting to hear from our Timber Merchant about three pieces which are required for breast beams.

Thank you for your letter of the 30th ultimo, the contents of which have now been read to the Mill Committee who were interested to know that you had visited the Mill site. We are particularly appreciative of your enclosure of a "s.a.e."

First to reply to your enquiry about the yoke, I enclose a sketch, and I can confirm that amongst our display information we do have a photograph showing this yoke, but unfortunately I cannot send same to you.

As to the progress of the restoration, because the work is being done entirely by volunteers it is a slow job, the work having to be done when the volunteers are available; however, having said that I would inform you that there had to be much preparation of the Mill, like taking out really rotton timbers, before the restoration could be commenced. At the present time the work being done is the renewal of the trestle and crown tree. We have been fortunate in getting oak for this work in the large dimensions required, and we have on order oak for the breast beams, but to date our timber Merchant has been unable to find suitable oak.

Volunteers are always needed, but it would be of help to me to know in what way you think you might be able to help. On the Mill site the work if obviously very physical, but the Committee is now considering whether it would be possible to organise a "Society of Friends" for the Mill and I wonder whether it would be possible for you to help in the administration of this for example. I am sorry I cannot be more definite about help at the moment, but this is a very difficult question unless one knows of any expertise which a person might have.

I hope this letter is of help to you, and should you find any history of the mill which you think might be of interest to us, then I hope you will pass same on to us; in the meantime I enclose anhistory sheet for your retention.





Originally, having not seen you for sometime, it was my intention to write and suggest that I had a meeting with you, but since then I understand that you have seen John and he has brought you up to date in connection with actual work at the Mill.

I understand also that John mentioned Deeds to you. There are some aspects of deeds today, and what appears to be some Solicitors' attitudes to same which rather bothers me, quite apart from researching through same. It appears that because it is necessary now only to divulge title for 15 years, and also because of compulsory registration of property, early deeds, instead of going to record offices for safe custody, are appearing on the open market and are being purchased by collectors at auctions. I have raised the matter with one or two Solicitars know personally, but they have not experienced the problem, but in Ditchling there is one person I know who has appeared to have "lost" some very early deeds of her property. Obviously not all early deeds are important, but when they relate to Estates, such as Oldland Estate, then I feel that either the owner should have control of said deeds or same should be in safe custody. This was one point I wanted to mention to you.

The other was in connection with actually inspecting your very early deeds because whilst I have seen the earliest deeds the Archaeological Society was given, such deeds were copies and referred to earlier deeds, and it is possible that amongst your very carliest deeds there might be a cross reference to the documents I am looking for. I tried getting this information prior to Major Phillipson's death, but he had had Oldland House put onto a registered title and consequently his early deeds had, to quote the Major, "disappeared". I realise that it might be difficult for you to produce the deeds at home, but what I would like to do, providing there is no objection, is to make an appointment either with your Solicitors or whereever the deeds are in safe custody, so that I could inspect the early deeds. I am quite happy to go to London to carry out this research. I have no wish to put you to the undue trouble of trying to arrange for the deeds to be in Reyner. Your enquiry about grant aid has been passed to me for reply after a delay, for which I apologise.

The Fund administered by the Science Museum, on behalf of the Museums and Galleries Commission, was set up in 1973 essentially to encourage and assist the <u>acquisition</u> by museums of items of technological and scientific interest. Because of restrictions imposed on the scope of the Fund at the time of its inception, we are not able to assist with the costs of restoring objects which are already in the ownership of the applicant organisations at the time of acquisition.

It seems that, since no change of ownership of Oldland Windmill is envisaged, its restoration cannot fall within the scope of our grant in aid fund. I am sorry to have to disappoint you, since it is clear from your letter and its enclosure that your Association is approaching the problem of the Mill's gradual dilapidation in a realistic and practical manner.

I imagine that you will already have approached your County Council for help with the costs. It is also worth contacting the Wind and Watermills Section of the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings, if you have not already done so. The SPAB is unlikely to be able to extend any direct offer of grant aid, but may be able from long experience in these matters, to suggest other possible sources of subsidy. You are welcome to write to me again in say, twelve months time in case it may have been possible by then to alter the scope of our Fund.

When the Hassocks Amenity Association leased the above Mill from the Sussex Archaeological Society, members of the Archaeological Society kindly responded to an Appeal for funds, and I am sure would be interested to know of the progress being made at the Mill; hence this "report".

To start with the Mill had to be dismantled and the machinery removed, and then it was necessary to support the shell of the Mill on "A" frames before any true restoration could commence. As the work is being done by a group of volunteers with limited time available, the work does not proceed at a fast rate, but the actual restoration has now commenced.

The first stage was to renew the trestle, and in part it was difficult to find oak timber. The Mill Restoration Committee very much wanted to do the restoration work in oak if at all possible as the Mill was originally built of oak. The fact bat there is so much oak in Oldland Mill indicates that it is possibly one of the oldest Post Mills in the County. All the timber for the next trestle has now been installed in the Mill. This has necessitate taking away part of the round house (which in the case of Oldland Mill is actually "octagonal") and then the timbers were eased into position.

An example of the size of timbers involed is a recent delivery of two side girts which are 16.6" x 9" x 18". Earlier timber for the crown tree was delivered the sixe of which was 13' x 2' x 2'. The cost of the timber for the trestle and the crown tree was in the region of £2,000.00. The account for the side girts has yet to be received.

Fortunately the main post does not have to be remewed, but we have on order timber for new breast boams, and as this has to be slightly curved, the Timber Merchant is having problems finding a suitable tree. The crown tree is now prepared and has to be installed at rightangles on top of the main post. It has been decided that it will be necessary to have expert help with the installation of the crown tree as this will involve scaffolding and a crane to do the main lifting of such a large baulk of timber. The cost involved in having proffessional help is in the region of £1,500.00

Side by side with the restoration one has to organise the very necessary fundraising, and this is done in a variety of ways. The first major amount was obtained by an Exhibition and show on Ditchling Village Green, kindly organised by two residents of Ditchling. Oldland Mill being right on the boundary between Ditchling and Keymer, we are fortunate in having great interest in the Mill from both side of the boundary. The next major input was a sponsored walk by a Local Postman (namely Reg Adsett who is a member of the Sussex Archaeological Society), and since then we have been fortunate in obtaining some sponsorship from Industry, a grant from the Mid Sussex

I refer to our telephone co nversation, and apologise for the delay in writing to you after the Mill Coffee morning; unfortunately I had to go away to St. Albans in connection with an elderly Aunt.

I now enclose a copy of the Mill History, and also apologise for the condition of the same, but at present we are awaiting new sheets to be printed, and I "rescued the enclosed from something else.

As to the actual work at the Mill, the first stage was to renew the trestle, after dismantling parts of the mill and such existing machiner; and supporting the shell of the mill on an "A" frame. Part of the delay in restoration has been occasioned by the availability of wood. The Mill Committee very much wanted to do the restoration work in cak if at all possible as the mill was originally built of oak. The fact that there is so much oak in Oldland Mill indicates that it is possibly one of the oldest Post Mills in the County. the timber for the new trestle has now been installed in the mill, and this necessitated taking away part of the round house (which in the case of Oldland Mill is actually "omtagonal"), and then the timbers were eased into postion. An example of the size of timbers involved is a recent delivery of two side girts which are 16'6 x 9" x 18". The largest individual piece of timber was the crown tree which was 13' x 2' x 2'. The cost of the timber for the trestle and the crown tree was in the region of £2,000.00, which will give you an indication of the price of oak. Fortunately the main post does not have to be renewed. We have on order timber for new breast beams, but as these have to be slightly curved, the Timber Merchant is having problems finding suitable trees.

The crown tree is now prepared and has to be installed at rightangles on top of the main post. It has been decided that it will be necessary to have expert help with the installation of the crown tree as this will involve scaffolding and a crane to do the main lifting of such a large baulk of timber. The cost involved in having professional help is in the region of £1,500

The work is being done by a small group of volunteers with limited time available, so does not progress swiftly. In the circumstances it is not possible to give any estimated finishing date, but it is possible to quote a figure of around \$40,000.00 to do the complete restoration. Partly because it is rather difficult to cope with large sums of money the Mill Committee has taken the view that it is better to raise money from time to time rather than endeavour to get \$40,000.00 as quickly as possible, and at present there is about \$10,000.00 in the Mill fund; however the Committee is very conscious of the need for money, and for this reason from time to time fund raising events are organised, such as coffee mornings and having stalls and loval events. We are fortunate in that we have had some sponsorship and also great financial support from a local postman who did a sponsored walk, and also gives talks from time to time. This gives you an idea as to how we tackle the financial situation, and any help anyone

can give in connection with fund raising is always very much appreciated.

Another facet is research into the history of the mill. Again a very time consuming occupation, but one finds out much interesting information about families and ways of life in the past. Just at present I do not have the time I would like to find out more about the Mill, and really only do this very spasmodically, which means going over previous ground to find out where one finished previously. I recently saw an Estate Map which gives a date possibly of 1703, and if this can be verified, then it will be the earliest date so far for the Mill. The problem is the fact that the map has faded.

The object is to restore the mill to a working condition, partly because it has features which other mills in the county do not have, and partly to preserve the area which previously formed part of the Oldland Estate. When finished it is hoped that it will be possible to have school parties there, and generally show folk a working mill.

I think this is all the information I can give you at present, but if you think of anything else, please do not hesitate to contact me, and if you can raise money for the mill, then this would be a great help.

On looking through my Mill file I note with concern that it is over a year since I wrote to you last, and I do apologise for the delay in reporting progress to Vent Axia.

I particularly wanted to enclose a letter with the Christmas wishes of the Mill Chairman and Committee to you all, because of the storm in October. I am pleased to say that although one of the substantial oak tress on the south side of the Mill was blown over, and did in fact rest on the mill, fortunately very little damage was done to the Mill.

The current position is that the trestle has now been installed and we have just accepted a quotation of £1150.00 from Austin Cradles Ltd. to erect scaffolding and with a crane instal the crown tree into the Mill. For those who have visited the Mill the crown tree is the large baulk of timber which was in the garage to the west of the Mill. It was decided that the trestle timbers could be moved into the Mill without assistance, but as a matter of safety it was deemed wiser to get help to instal the crown tree.

Timber for breast beams has been on order for over a year, but the Timber Merchant is having trouble finding the correct shape timber which has to be a little curved. No doubt now there will be much timber about, but not necessarily oak suitable for Oldland Mill.

I would appreciate it if you would kindly pass on the information in this letter to all concerned, and I hope it will not be too long in 1988 before a visit to the Mill can be arranged.


