Dear Mrs Annette

I refer to our recent conversation regarding providing insurance for yourselves in respect of Oldland Mill.

In view of the nature of the work which you are carrying out my recommendation is that coverage should be provided under a Construction Insurance Policy which would provide you with "All Risks" cover. On this basis the annual premium required to insure the building of the Mill for the sum of £40,000 would amount to £150 - the premium to insure the tools and associated items would amount to £25 and the premium to provide £1m. worth of indemnity under Public Liability insurance would amount to £75. The building and tools insurance would be subject to £100 excess. The total annual cost of the coverage as set out above would therefore amount to £250 and if you wish this can be paid on a monthly basis, the monthly premium amounting to £22.08.

I am enclosing the appropriate proposal form together with a monthly insurance application and now look forward to receipt of your further advices in early course.





To points, as follows, upon which I seek your advice and help:-

(a) Insurance - I do not know what progress, if any, you have been able to make in this connection, but I have received a quote from Brombard, and I enclose a copy of the appropriate letter. I am sorry such copy is a little late in getting to you. Obviously, as the Archaeological Society is the freeholder of the Mill, the Mill Committee did not wish to proceed further with Brombard without you having sight of the letter from Brombard, and also obviously if you could arrange better terms, then we would not proceed with Brombard. I await to hear from you in due course.

(b) Timber - This is more encouraging. Further timber has now been inspected at the Timber Merchants, Messrs. Lillywhites at Charlton (same as before), and the following timber has been ordered:-

4 - off 15'6" x 6" x 8"  
2 - off 15'6" x 9" x 18".

The above timbers ~~are~~ required to replace the side girts on the Mill and have to be oak. We have been fortunate in that the Merchants have kept their price down to £12. per cubic foot as before, but even so the cost is about £300.00. In view of the cost, I am writing to enquire whether it would be possible for the Archaeological Society to purchase such timber on our behalf, and this Association would be happy to make a donation in respect of the timber as we did previously. I confirm that the Association does have the money to give such a donation. One problem in getting timber for the Mill is to get the lengths and dimensions and for this reason we now go directly to timber merchants who actually fell trees retaining the long lengths; also many timber merchants are cutting up wood in small pieces to make planking around 8'-10' long at the most.

I look forward to hearing from you, perhaps by telephone if this is easier for you, at your earliest convenience.

Although a little late, John joins me in sending you all good wishes for 1986.

For those who have an interest in Windmills, you will have been aware of the existence of Oldland Mill from the article by Mr. Frank Gregory, and this is in a sense a "follow-up" to give more detailed information about Oldland Mill. In 1980 the Hassocks Amenity Association, of which I am Chairman, accepted the challenge to restore the above Mill, which was in a very bad condition. The freehold of the Mill is vested in the Sussex Archaeological Society, but when the Mill was conveyed to this Society in 1927, the Society had no financial obligation to keep the Mill in good repair. To undertake the restoration it was necessary for the Amenity Association to lease the Mill from the Archaeological Society, and from 1980 onwards it was necessary to dismantle the inside of the Mill and then to support the Mill on "A" frames before any true restoration could commence. As the work is being done by a group of volunteers with limited time available, the work does not proceed at a fast rate, but at last proper restoration has commenced.

The first stage was to renew the trestle, and in part it was difficult to find oak timber. The Mill Restoration Committee very much wanted to do the restoration work in oak if at all possible as the Mill was originally built of oak. The fact that there is so much oak in Oldland Mill indicates that it is possibly one of the oldest Post Mills in the County. All the timber for the new trestle has now been prepared, and the next step is to install same in the Mill. This has necessitated taking away part of the round house (which in the case of Oldland Mill is actually "octagonal") and then the timbers can be slide into position. An example of the size of timbers involved is a recent delivery of two side girts which are 15'6" x 9" x 18". Earlier, timber for the crown tree was delivered, the size of which was 13' x 2' x 2'.

Fortunately the main post does not have to be renewed, but we have on order timber for new breast beams, and as this has to be slightly curved, the Timber Merchant is having problems finding a suitable tree. The crown tree, when it is prepared, namely the appropriate joints are made and then the wood treated for bugs etc., will have to go at rightsangles on top of the main post, and this will be the next stage after the installation of the trestle. One problem in connection with the trestle was the fact that the Mill was originally constructed with an open trestle, and the roundhouse was built afterwards, partly to keep the trestle dry and partly to provide extra storage space for the Miller.

Side by side with the restoration one has to organise the very necessary fund-raising, and this is done in a variety of ways. The first major amount was obtained by an Exhibition and show on Ditchling Village Green, kindly organised by two residents of Ditchling. Oldland Mill being right on the boundary between Ditchling and Keymer, we are fortunate in having great interest in the Mill.

from both sides of the boundary. The next major input was a sponsored walk by a Local Postman, and since then we have been fortunate in obtaining sponsorship from Industry, the Mid Sussex District Council and a member of the family of the original Landowners. However such money is soon spent when one piece of timber can cost around £1,000.00, namely the crown tree. We are very fortunate in that the adjoining landowners have been very generous, both with donations and help with storage space and working space, but fund-raising is ever with us, and necessitates holding coffee mornings and having stalls at local Fetes and Fairs - this is all part of restoring a windmill.

Another facet is research into the history of the Mill, and once embarked upon such research, one then finds out much interesting information about families and ways of life in the past. In this connection I would very much appreciate anyone getting in contact with me should they have any old photographs of Oldland Mill, or indeed any information about the Mill. 

Dear Mrs Annett,

I popped up the lane to see Oldland mill today and was interested to see that the track timber one end was more interesting still. I noticed that there were several paint marks on the original stems. These appear to be typical millwrights marks and I wonder is one of the groups has a note of these. I suspect that the original track was the work of Medhurst the Leves millwright. I would be very interested to see anything which might identify the craftsmen. Was any pine used?

Regarding the history of the mill, the things have come to light recently

(2)

which might help.

This visit to the Remnant of Ditchling kindly invited me over a little time ago. To see some research notes of hers. She has diligently established that an early windmill stood on the fore point of Lodge Hill at Ditchling between 1624 & approximately 1670 <sup>fell down</sup> (between 1666 & 1668).

This establishes Lodge Hill as a traditional mill site. There would not have been enough work for two windmills, however this does not rule out the possibility.

I would be most interested to know of positive evidence of the existence of Oldland mill before Groom's survey of 1795 carried out in 1783 by Seakell & Gendres. I was unable to confirm the 1755 reference and no mill is shown on any maps before 1783.

This does sound rather negative. I have but stress important to me as to the mill groups to establish Oldland mill's age.

The second reference comes from the day to day account book of a Jones journeyman millwright named Pungshay who worked in the area until 1852.

He makes several references to 'Ditchlin's' 'Kimmer' and 'Oldford' mill. It seems pretty obvious that the mill was the subject of a great deal of attention in the late 1820s (perhaps even overbuilt).

My account of the history of Kaymer mill is inconclusive. I know but based on the available evidence at that time. Hopefully everything will become clear in time to come.

An extract from Jessie Pungshay's notes is to be published in the next S.P.A.S. History.

Thank you also for the annual peppercorn cheque for £1, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.


