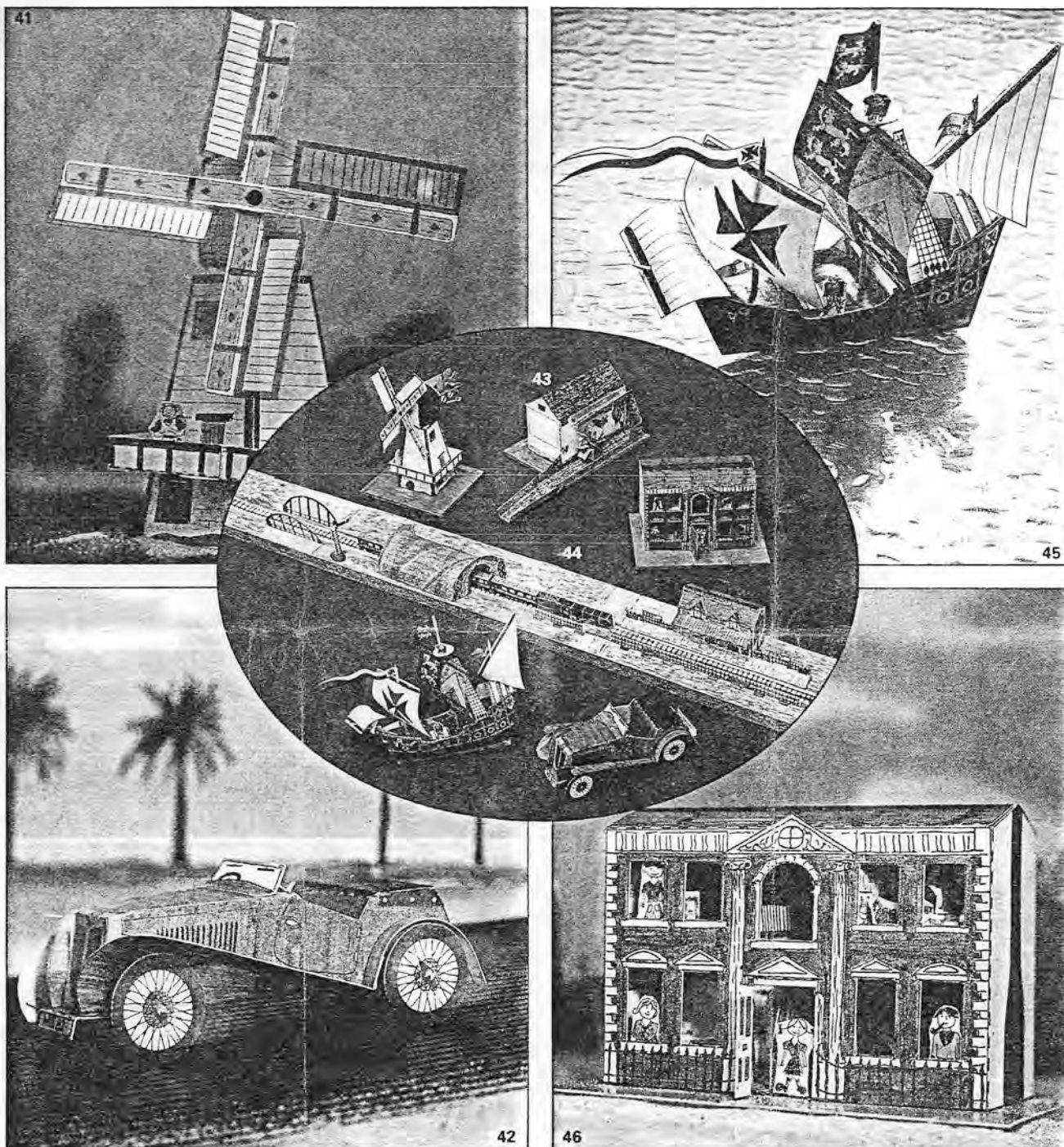

The six models in this section share two qualities that will appeal to most parents and children (in that order): they are cheaper than they look, and they work. All need to be coloured, cut out and glued, and the finished products although unlikely to get into the Design Index are decorative enough to satisfy average tastes.

41. Windmill - Watch the sails rotate as it turns into the wind. 6" high.

42. M.G. Sports Car - ... Had its

designers stuck to elastic power, the marque might be with us today ... 4½" long.

43. Watermill - Takes about an hour to make; a pint of water should keep the wheel turning for about 5 minutes. Length - including water trough - about 8".

44. Train - Includes bridge, tunnel, station, level crossing, signals. 6 feet of track, and a train 10" long which is pulled by cotton thread, weighted by modelling

material (26 above).

45. Galleon - About 6" long. Half a dozen or so, armed with toothpicks etc., would make a convincingly formidable armada (Nott, if you are still around, please note).

46. Dolls House - About 4" wide. Including stairs, furniture, pets, people (and thus a loo). In the nursery is the smallest dolls house in the world ½" long.

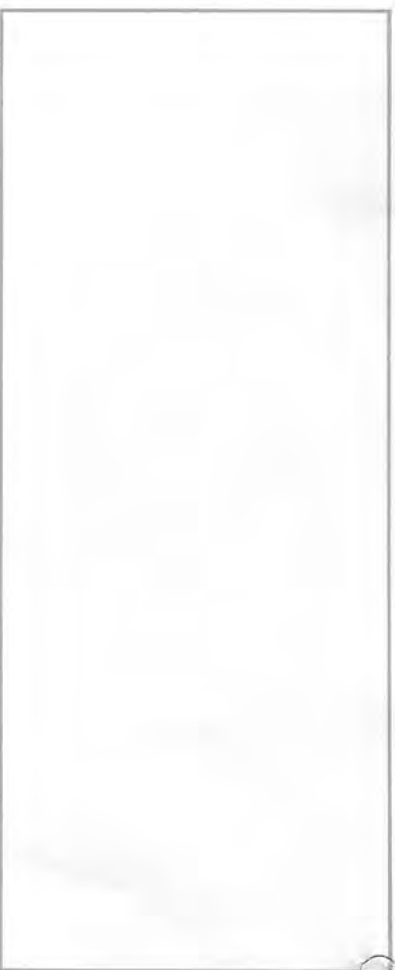

This is to tell you that the proposed Mill Committee Meeting for the 14th instant has been cancelled. Chris Zeuner is coming to Ditchling that evening, and John and I would particularly like to see him. I am waiting to hear from Herbert Sale when a fresh date is suitable, and I will advise you as soon as I am able.

In the meantime I am sorry to have to put one job your way, but just before Christmas a Mr. Oakley (I believe that he used to be "Major Oakley" and I think is possibly a member of the Sussex Archaeological Society) telephoned and wanted detailed information, with costs supporting the information, about the Mill repairs because he knows someone who might be able to give a considerable sum of money to the Mill. This is a man I have had correspondence with before, and in fact sent a copy of the Millwright's report; however it would appear he has mislaid the previous information, and would now like to speak to a "knowledgeable" person about Oldland Mill. He then told me that he would not be available until after the 7th January 1982. In the circumstances I told him that I would request you to contact him after the 7th instant. Mr. Oakley is now retired and I understand is more in a position to give his attention to the matter.

As far as I am concerned you are obviously the best person to speak to him, and if it is necessary to meet him, then I enclose spare copies of the short History and the Millwright's Report which he can hand over to the potential benefactor. If necessary I am quite happy to meet Mr. Oakley with you.

Mr. Oakley lives at 3, Hurst Road, Hassocks, initials "J.L.D." and telephone number Hassocks 4797. I hope we shall eventually get money from this source, although he is emphatic that it is from someone he knows - he informs me that he does not have that sort of money!



It appears that the structure at H.S Mill was in a better condition whereby the steel framework was designed for jacking up the Mill. Apparently the structure at Oldland is not suitable to receive the steel frame. The Structural Engineer referred to broken bones which would break apart. He suggests that a scaffolding frame is erected around the Mill as soon as possible and a crane formed to remove the heavy items and to dismantle the structure down to the post. 

I believe Mrs. Kasparian has already discussed with you a fund raising event at the beginning of October, and she suggested that I contact you to put forward some suggestions as I understand that you are a member of the fund raising Committee at the Church, and I regret that I do not know who the other members are.

To give you a little background, I understand that Mrs. Ellis suggested that perhaps a Flower Festival could be arranged to get money, I believe, for more kneelers. I got involved because I have worked some of the kneelers and the matter was discussed at an Embroidery group meeting; however following the original suggestion, it occurred to Mrs. Kasparian and myself that perhaps the whole project could be expanded and a big effort was made to make a considerable sum of money, sharing the profits between the Mill and the Church, because obviously I want to make money for the Mill. I have now discussed the matter further with Mrs. Ellis and she agrees that it would be better to expand the original suggestion if this is possible.

I understand that it was suggested that the Flower Festival should be at Harvest Festival, and it is felt by Mrs. Ellis and myself that the whole event should cover the Friday, Saturday and Sunday, with the setting up of everything on the Thursday.

To expand the project it is felt that it must have a theme, and the theme could be based around the life of the Turner Family who for many years were connected with the Church and the Mill. More details of this aspect of it can be given to you later.

The main points to realise now is the fact that if it is feasible to have a Flower Festival and Exhibition, then arrangements must commence immediately, such as advanced publicity, contacting Exhibitors and Museums, making sure there will be a team of caterers to provide coffee and tea, and think of possibly ploughman's lunches. Someone must be available to sleep in the Church Hall, which will, of course, be needed to house the exhibition part, because this is a stipulation made by Insurance Companies.

I personally would be happy to join a small committee just to help organise the event, and I am prepared to do a lot of the early work in getting exhibits, arranging early publicity,

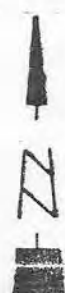



This is just a general letter to tell you the current position.

- (a) Electricity - Seeboard have not yet completed the installation and after some enquiries by my husband, we understand that the Seeboard will put in the meters after some of the fittings are installed. My husband will deal with the installation of fittings as soon as he is able.
- (b) Site generally - Major Philipson was going to deal with the grass etc., but did not do so, and unfortunately during May, due to family problems, I have been away either for the day or weekend, so have been unable to get to the Mill to clear up the site myself, but again this I will attend to as soon as possible now that life has returned to normal.
- (c) Mill committee - There is to be some re-organisation of this due to two resignations, one of which was the Architect, and it is to be hoped that new committee members will be in a position to help speed progress at the Mill.
- (d) Fund raising - This is going more slowly this year, partly because I feel that more effort should now be concentrated on actual work at the Mill. The next job is to remove the machinery and stones from the Mill, which raises the problem of storage as they will have to be under cover; likewise the sail which is at present on the grass at the side of the Mill. I did have a barn in mind, but unfortunately it was burnt down.
- (e) Steel support - Regrettably the Architect arranged an inspection of the Mill by the Engineer who designed the steelwork for High Slavington Mill, without Mr. Gregory being present. This resulted in the Engineer saying that the steelwork was not suitable, and so on that problem we are back to square one and will have to get scaffolding now.

I think this brings you up to date, and I look forward to seeing you sometime. With best wishes to you both,

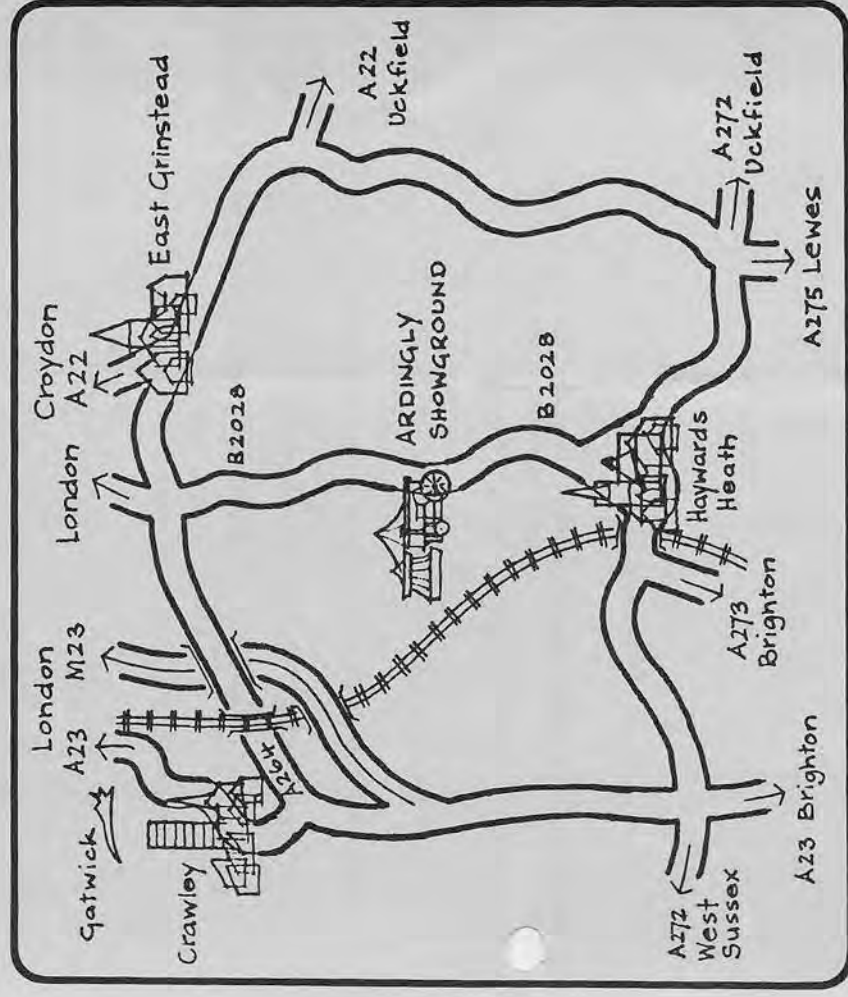

Please read the notes below carefully and let everyone in your party know what is happening. This will greatly help us in placing everyone quickly and easily, also it will ensure you have a problem free day and that the event runs smoothly.

VERY IMPORTANT : This request primarily affects those who stay overnight. Last year neighbours of the Showground had cause to complain of excessive late evening noise from the entertainment and camping areas. As a result we are having to work under much stricter restrictions this year and we ask everyone's utmost co-operation in minimising noise after 6pm. In particular the playing of amplified music and the running of generators after that time is prohibited.

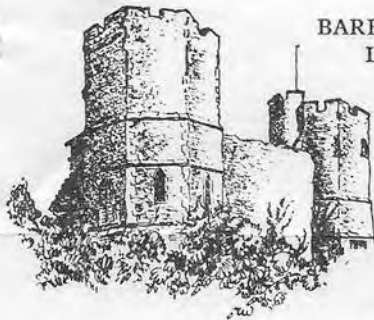



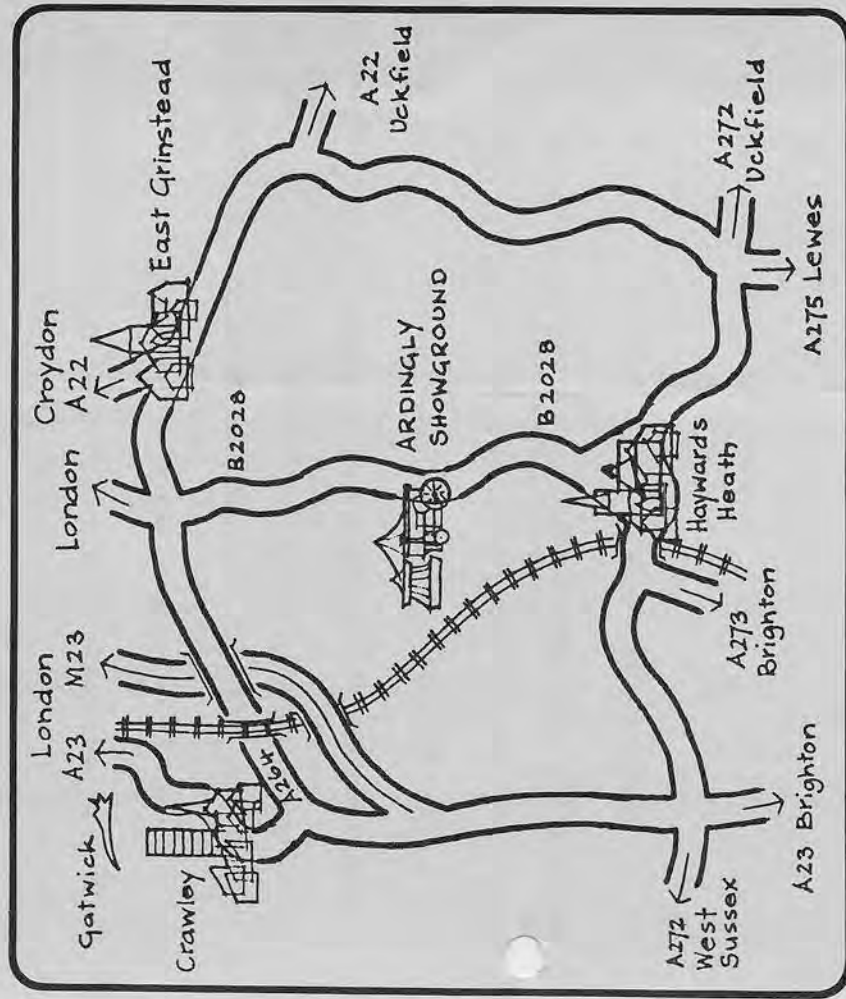

Please read the notes below carefully and let everyone in your party know what is happening. This will greatly help us in placing everyone quickly and easily, also it will ensure you have a problem free day and that the event runs smoothly.

Publicity about the Spectacular is all important to everyone. Please do all you can to tell others about the Show and persuade them to come. If you can show posters, car stickers or give away handbills just call Derek Thorne at 01-653-8348 and he will get some to you.

Have a good journey and if you have any questions please contact your section steward - call 01-647-7000 if you have forgotten who he is!

VERY IMPORTANT : This request primarily affects those who stay overnight. Last year neighbours of the Showground had cause to complain of excessive late evening noise from the entertainment and camping areas. This almost resulted in our losing the use of the Showground for the rally. As a result we are having to work under much stricter restrictions this year and we ask everyone's utmost co-operation in minimising noise after 6pm. In particular the playing of amplified music and the running of generators after that time is prohibited.

Secondly, for safety reasons, the riding by juniors of small 'mini-motor-bikes' around the site is also prohibited. We make this rule before serious injury or damage results. Crowded showgrounds are not the place for this kind of activity.

DIRECTIONS AND PASSES : ARDINGLY is on the B 2028 road between Haywards Heath and Turners Hill. It is signposted 'South of England Showground' in addition to the 'Steam Rally' roadsigns that will be erected.

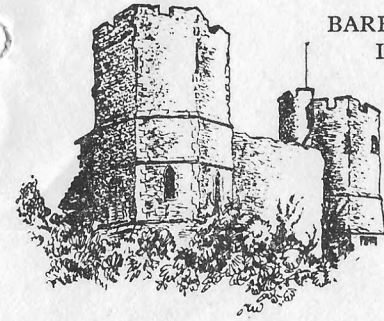

I have just received two Forms 3006-1/82, which I return herewith showing zero readings. I note that Sheet No. 509621330 relates to Normal Rate and Sheet No. 509621322 relates to Low Rate. I also note that Meter No. S8104163 is stated to be positioned in the Mill.

I confirm that there is no meter in the Mill, and it is not intended, at this point in time, that there will be a meter in the Mill. The reason electricity is required at the Mill is to use power tools in order to work on the restoration of the Mill, and in this connection Mr. Hawkings-Byass of Oldland Mill House has kindly put his garage at our disposal. There are Wayleave Agreements to get the cable across the adjoining field which belongs to Major Philipson and to site the cable and meter in the garage which belongs to Mr. Hawkings-Byass. For this reason there should always be access to the meter in the garage when the Seeboard's representative calls at Oldland Mill House.

I have now discussed the position with your Crawley Office, and I am informed that a White Meter was installed at "Oldlands" on the 13th May last; this meter has definitely not been installed in either the Mill or the garage. There is yet another adjoining property which is Oldland House, which has Oldland Cottage as part of its curtilage, and presumably it is possible that a meter has been installed there. If that is the case, then this Association is not responsible for meters which are installed at Oldland House or any adjoining premises forming part of Oldland House. 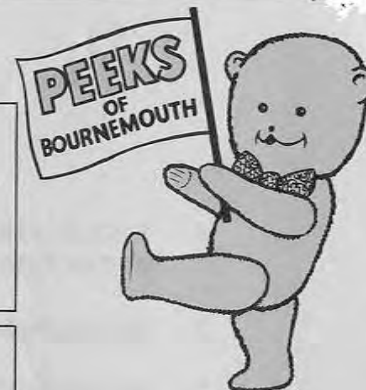

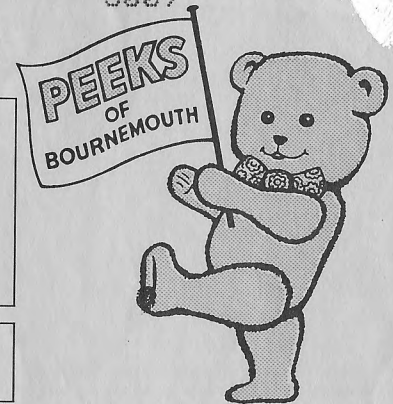

It was nice to see you the other evening at Ditchling. Thank you very much for returning the papers I left with you and also the £1 note being rent in arrear for last year.*

I have been considering the fact that this Society continues to pay the insurance premium (including public liability) on the Mill. I have looked through the lease, and so far as I can see there is no obligation on us to insure, but equally neither is there an obligation on you to do so, or to contribute to our cost of insurance.

Thank you for your letter of the 19th ultimo, and I confirm that the letter is sufficient receipt for the payment of rent.

On the question of insurance, it has taken me a little time to go through the various files which were originally started (prior to my being concerned personally about the Mill), and because the position was far from clear I raised the question of insurance with Captain Wigg in a meeting which I had with him on the 17th April 1980. At that time Captain Wigg confirmed that the Archaeological Society had the Mill covered under a block policy and this situation would continue. I understood at that time the policy covered general public liability, fire and "acts of God". As to people working in the Mill, Captain Wigg was going to check the position.

Subsequently on the 19th June 1980 I received a letter from Captain Wigg who confirmed that the Society's Policy would cover members of this Association working on the Mill and the position would not alter after the Lease was completed.

Because I was doing some research on the Turner family, I also obtained from Captain Wigg's permission to inspect the Society's early deeds relating to the Mill. When I attended at the Solicitors' office I was informed that it was not usual to inspect deeds in connection with a Lease. I explained that I was not acting on behalf of the Association in connection with the Lease but wished to see the earlier deeds for historical reasons. Notwithstanding that I was informed that the Lease had to stand as originally drawn and as the previous Lease with Mr. Hawkings-Byass had been completed. I then took the opportunity to mention insurance which was not covered by the Lease, and again I was told that as the Freeholders your Society would keep the Mill insured.

I appreciate the point raised by you, and it was partly in anticipation of any future change which might have to take place that I tried to get the question of insurance


